

Please excuse us for any inconveniences we could cause you by our message. It is our first and last message and we will never bother you again.



COMPARISON OF BATTERY TECHNOLOGIES

....by Ken W6HHC

Last month, I showed a comparison of battery technologies and how much progress each technology had made over the last few years. This month I want to compare the energy capacity of Nickle Metal Hydride (NiMH) and Nickle Cadmium (NiCD) batteries to the common Alkaline batteries. The main claim for Lithium (note; iron not ion) batteries is their 10 year shelf life.

Comparison of AA size Batteries

AA - LITHIUM - 2,570 mAh ** \$3.50 ea
AA - ALKALINE - 2,200 mAh ** \$0.80 ea
AA - NiMH - 1,600 mAh \$2.50 ea
AA - NiCD - 840 mAh \$2.50 ea

Note ** - Lithium and Alkaline NOT rechargeable

It is important to recognize in the above table that Alkaline and Lithium batteries are not re-chargeable and NiMH and NiCD provide better value. For example, NiMH can be re-charged 200 times for a total capacity of 200 x 1,600 mAh = 320,000 mAh.

- 4 Alkaline batteries cost \$3.25 (2,200 mAh)
- 4 NiMH batteries cost \$10.00 (320,000 mAh)
- It would cost 145 Alkaline batteries for \$117 to achieve the same 320,000 mAh!!!!!
