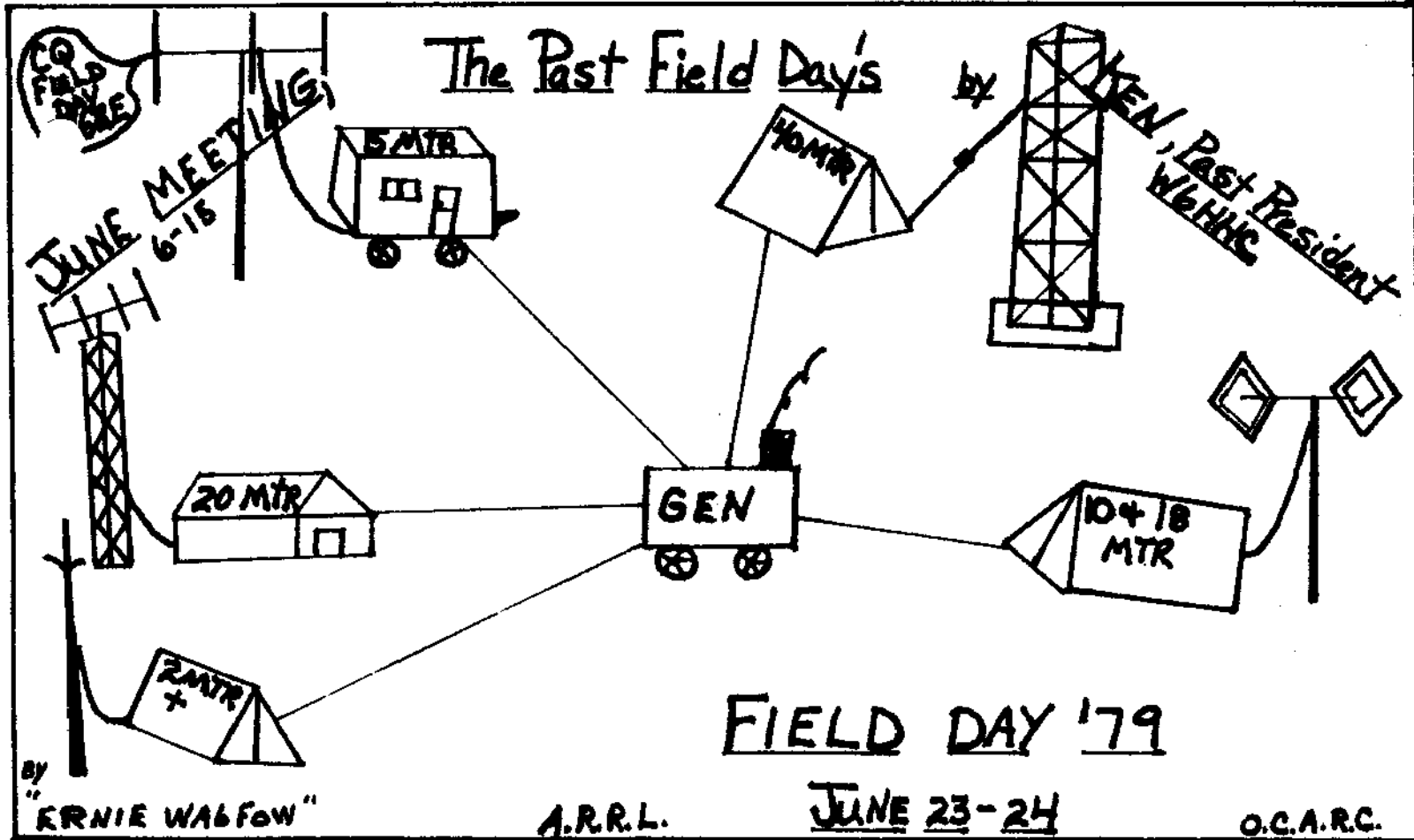

Notes from League Officer's Meeting Held Saturday, June 2nd in Pasadena with W6EJJ
 SW Div. Director presiding. J. Terry WA6IHZ and Bill Weise W6CPB, were in attendance from
 this area along with SCM's Asst. Directors and others from San Diego to Santa Barbara.

It was announced that WARC starts in Geneva on September 24, and that one of the
 official delegates will be W3OKN Merrill Glunt who has been active in preparing the U.S.
 position. Read his qualifications on p60 May QST.

ARRL is acting as clearing house for proposals from all countries and has received
 47 to date. From them, it appears that Amateur Radio is fairing quite well with just a
 little trimming here and there. Several contain proposals for amateurs on 10, 18 and 24
 MHz segments.

U.S. is the only country to propose sharing 220-225 with Maritime Mobile Service.
 Since European TV is there, it is unlikely that the U.S. proposal will be considered
 which will leave 220 about as is.

On the subject of jamming, it was pointed out that the worst way of handling the
 problem is to become a jammer yourself. Best to ignore, DF and expose and with proper
 evidence, FCC will prosecute and has.

It was announced that past SW Div. Director, a long time amateur friend and writer of
 amateur column in Herald Examiner, Ray Meyers W6MLZ, is quite ill. Cards and QSL's will
 help.

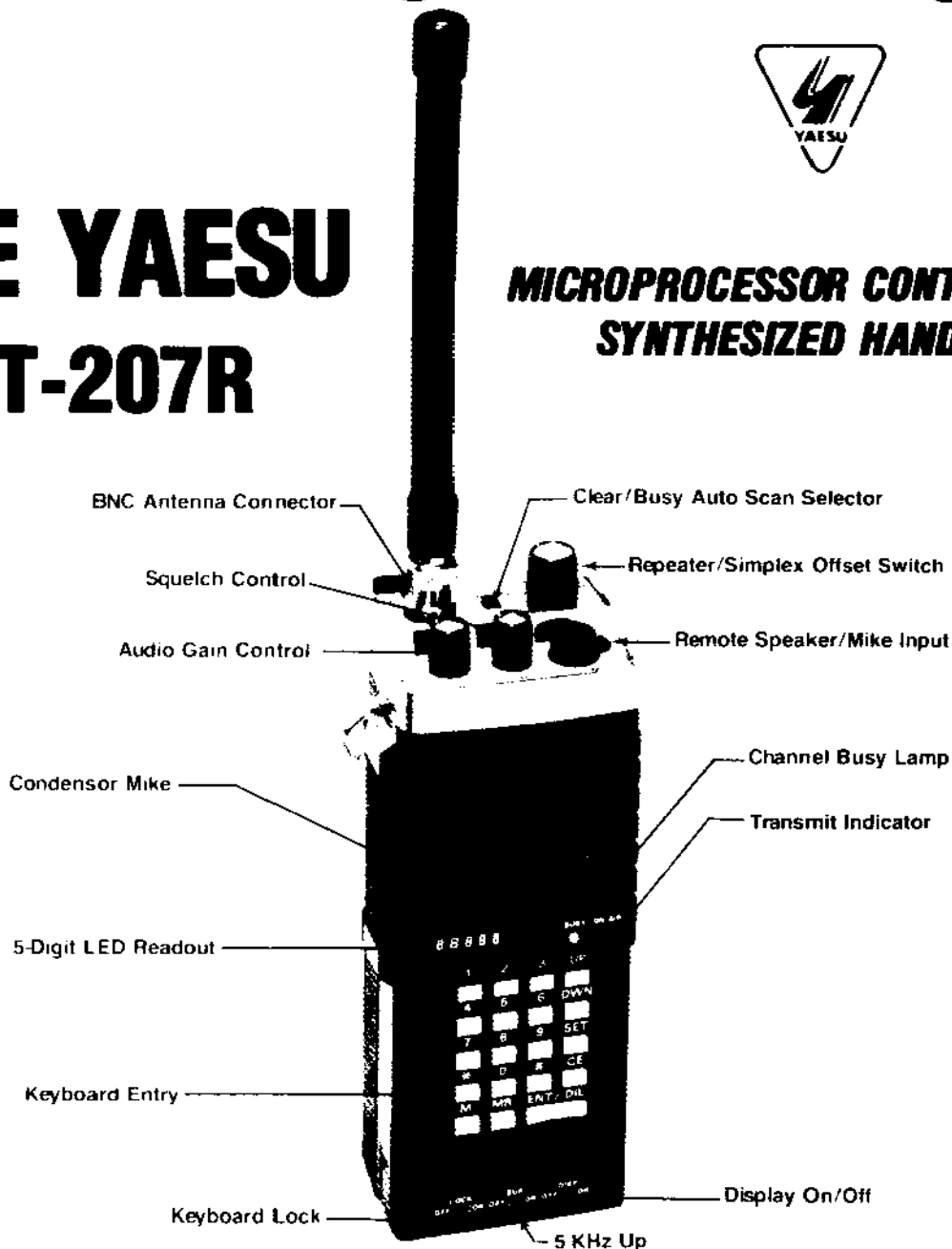

Tustin. Attendance 55.

The President Terry WB6IHZ welcomed everyone and began with the flag salute. The Secretary Sandi WA6WZN read the roll call of officers. The previous meeting minutes were approved as printed in the RF. The Vice President Ernie WA6FOW introduced the slide program and tape recording by Jan WA6YGW (of her recent DX-pedition to Chatham Island) that was presented by George WA6QBI. Field Day was discussed and a motion was made by Frank WA6VKZ and was seconded by Bill WA6YKH to spend up to \$170 for expenses incurred by Field Day operations; the motion passed. Nominations were opened from the floor for Activity chairman; Jess W6LEN was nominated by Fried WA6WZO after which he was elected the new Activity Chairman. Barbara N6AUA (from the Fullerton ARC) announced that she was taking sign ups for booth duty at the Orange County Fair Amateur Radio Booth. Fried WA6WZO made a motion to donate \$25.00 to the VIP group, Lou KA6BJO seconded and after a roll call of all members the motion passed. A discussion followed about having a roll call vote of members when money was involved and several members suggested that unless the vote was a close one then a roll call vote was not necessary. The Treasurer Frank WA6VKZ reported a total of \$659.53. Rudi Green volunteered to store the Field Day equipment that the club has accumulated thru out the years (which Kei W6NGO had previously stored). Mr. RF was Bill WA6YKH and Jaacko WA7ZTC was the lucky winner. New member: N6BJW. Visitors at May meeting: WA6GID, KA6AZN, N6AUA, WD6FNX, N7QQ.

Board Meeting minutes - June 3, 1979, 3 PM, at the QTH of A1, W6IBR.

Board members present were: WB6IHZ, WA6FOW, WA6VKZ, WA6WZN, W6IBR, W6LEN, WA6LFF.

Terry WB6IHZ summarized the League officials meeting that he and Sandi WA6WZN had attended on June 2nd in Pasenda.

Ken W6HHC Chairman of the Financial Planning Committee outlined the recommendations for the Board -- a discussion followed and the following items were adopted by the Board and will be presented for membership approval at the next meeting.

1. The club will purchase badges for members at cost and an additional 50¢ will be added on the price for postage.
2. Radio Raffle - Have a YAESU FT 7B (or equipment of equal value) for the door prize at the X-mas party. Have 200 books of tickets with 11 tickets per book at \$1 per ticket and when a club member sells one book he can keep the last ticket. Each club member will receive a book of tickets in the mail with their issue of RF.
3. We now receive \$30 in prizes for advertising in RF. The Board Recommend we spend approximately \$30 per month actual for prizes, in addition to the above. We also recommend conducting the raffle during the night of the auction.
4. All radio classes will be self-sustaining.
5. Recommend we do not bond the officers, which will require a constitutional change.

The 1980 recommendations presented by the Financial Review committee are listed below:

1. Change constitution to Additional Members of household is $\frac{1}{2}$ regular membership cost.
2. Increase annual dues to \$10 per year and early payment still 75% of regular dues, i.e. \$7.50.
3. Roster printing to be done by club members at their work QTH.
4. Look hard at alternate methods of printing the RF including buying our own mimeograph machine.
5. Consider having an annual raffle of a large item of gear.
6. Recommend we institute a roll call vote on items of expenditure for the club.
7. Look again at the 25% discount for early payment of membership dues.

These items will be discussed at the July 1st board meeting and the board proposals will be presented at the July meeting for membership approval.

Terry WB6IHZ nominated Fried WA6WZO (past president and past SCM of Orange Section) for Honorary membership in OCARC.


