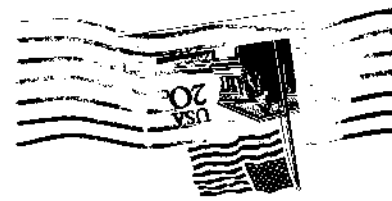
Security:
