For example, WIAW would become W200AW for one week in January.

Constitution.(5) Specifically, that proposal asks amateurs operating in their traditional call sign districts be authorized to replace the numeral in their call sign with a two-digit numeral corresponding to the order of entry into the Union (or in the case of the 13 original states, the order ratification of the Constitution) of the state from which the operation takes place.

For example, Connecticut was the fifth state to ratify the Constitution, so K1ZZ in Connecticut could sign K05ZZ. California was the 31st state to enter the Union, so KB6ZV would operate as KB31ZV.
