



OCARC Ham Awareness and Mini Field Day a Fun Success!

On October 19, 1991, the OCARC held a mini Field Day / Ham Awareness Day at three sites: Fountain Valley in front of Electronic Times, Tustin at Pinetree Park, and in Torrance in front of Audiotek. The project was directed by Frank, WA6VKZ.

Fountain Valley-by Carmine, KC6WTY Our site was run by Cindy KC6OPI, Bob KC6WWP, and Carmine KC6WTY. We set up a Kenwood 520 HF rig, Kenwood 941 and various handheld HTs covering the HF, VHF, and UHF spectrum. Cindy worked the HF rig on 10 and 15 meters, QSOing with Kodiac Island (Coast Guard), a Boy Scout promotion in Kentucky and other contacts of interest. Bob and Carmine worked the 2 meter and 440 bands, keeping contact with the other sites. At the same time, they also gave students in a novice/ tech class being taught at Electronic Times, a chance to use the UHF bands (third party, of course!) to show them the fun and use of ham radio.

Fred KC6JUP stopped by with his daughter, Stacy KC6JVJ who made her first 10 meter contact with encouragement from Nancy, N6XQR who was spotting more operators for her all YL 20 meter phone Field Day station.

We would like to thank Electronic Times for donating the use of the Kenwood 520 with all the hardware and antennas, and Michael KC6VTC and Bob AB6CH for their help and use of the store site.

Pinetree Park - by Frank, WA6VKZ Arrived on site at 9:00 AM to help Mike K6KAA with the annual S.E.T. Mike worked 2 meters, 440 and 10 meters. Prior to 10:00 AM Tom WA6PFA and cohort Bud WA6VPP arrived and set up Tom's ATV station.

Bruce KC6DLA arrived along with his portable/mobile packet station. WA6VKZ set up portable HF station. Accompled to work 10 meters with KK6YO with negative results, attempted to work 40 meters with KK6YO and had 1/2 a QSO - heard him but didn't work him. DX Notes (from Q5 Downey ARC newsletter) by Mike Gauthier, K6ICS

In the absence of major flares, look for good daytime openings on 10 and 12 meters, excellent signals on 15 and 17 meters, including some late at night, and excellent dawn and early evening openings on 20, including the westward longpath openings that begin an hour or so before local dawn. Low-band propagation will improve, but remain marginal. Try 80 meters when the K index drops to 2 or less.

ZA ALBANIA - Watch for new stations on the air. Current lists indicate the following stations are now operating: ZA1HA, ZA1QA, ZA1ZXV, ZA1ZMX, ZA1ZVX, ZA1DX, and ZA1TAA through ZA1TAL. When the band is open to I, YU, and LZ, you should also hear ZA if they are on the air. NOTE: ZA1A is now off the air.

ZD8 ASCENSION ISLAND - ZD8Z will be operating October 22 through November 5. QSL to N6TJ.

9M6 EASTERN MALAYSIA - 9M6NA will operate from LA-BUAN ISLAND, IOTA (Islands on the Air) number OC (Oceania) -133 from November 20-25. He has a 40 meter beam. Also look for him on 160 CW transmitting on 1806 or 1826 khz. QSL via JEUKL.

VS6 HONG KONG - VS6/GU4XGG will be on the air October 18 - December 5.

D2 ANGOLA - D2ACA will be operated by UT3UY during November and December. Exact dates are unknown at this time. NOTE: The recent operations by D2/UT4UM and D2/RT5UY were not licensed and will not count for DXCC.

5V TOGO - 5V7JG, Gerard, is operational till mid December. QSL via F2JG.

Understanding and Identifying CATVI by Jonathan Kramer, KD6MR

What and Where... ("Right where you DON'T want it!)
Cable television interference to amateur radio, usually abbreviated
"CATVI," typically occurs on 2 meters and 220 Mhz. The usual
frequencies are at or near 145.25 Mhz (cable channel 18[E]) and
223.25 Mhz (cable channel 24[K]). The interference is characterized by a constant "BUZZ" (the picture synch buzz) which gets

stronger as you get closer to the cable leak.

Why... ("What could be simpler?")

CATVI happens when cable television transmissions leak out of system. The reasons for leakage usually fall into three general categories:

Leakage due to poor shielding... Until the early 80's, coaxial drop cables (which connect the output of the signal tap to the back of the set) employed a single layer of braided wire as the grounded shield. Some drop cables had less than 70% of the center conductor covered, hence, the leakage.

Leakage due to crack shields... The main trunk and distribution coaxial cables used in CATV are constructed with a copperclad aluminum center conductor surrounded by a hardened foam. An aluminum tube forms the outside electrical shield. A plastic jacket is usually used to provide an environmental barrier. Unfortunately, aluminum expands and contracts as it is heated and cooled by day/night cycles. Radial ("ring") cracks can eventually develop at the point of maximum stress, usually at the back nut of a trunk/feeder connector. Leakage then occurs. Leakage can also occur if "smog" is permitted to erode unjacketed cables.

Leakage due to loose connectors and hardware... Another major source of signal leakage is loose connectors (commonly known as "F" connectors) on drop cables. Newer connectors have an integral sleeve to assist in shielding, but millions of older "2 piece" connectors are still out there, and are still being sold at the neighborhood electronics store. Also, if amplifier housings are not properly closed, or signal tap face plates are not tightened properly, leaks can occur.

Law of Reciprocity... ("We are not alone ...")

Simply put, if you can hear them, they can hear you. Not only does the cracked cable or poor shielding emit leakage, it permits ingress. Ever wonder why your neighbors claim you cause that "@#S!="TVI on their channels 18 and/or 24? Now you know!

Depending on where the ingress point is, you could be causing beat patterns for hundreds or thousands of your neighbors! Whose responsibility is it? As long as you are operating "...a radio communication service operating in accordance with [the FCC rules]..." (i.e. Part 97 of the FCC rules), it is the cable operator's responsibility. But for the sake of your neighborly relations, world peace, and sanity, work with the cable operator to help them identify the leak! (Cable TV Rule 47 CFR §76.613)

Find It... ("Who 'ya gonna call? Cable-Busters!")

Dial up 145.25 Mhz (or 144.0 Mhz in "HRC" cable systems) on
your handheld radio. Set your squelch to just close. As you get

closer to the leak, the squelch will break, the buzz will get louder, and the background noise will quiet down. Keep tightening the squelch as you get closer. When you can no longer squelch the radio, remove the antenna and then use the radio as a "near field" detector. Amaze your friends (and cable operator); sharpen your T-Hunting skills. When you've located the leak, or the approximate location, call your cable operator. While you can try to describe your highly technical problem to a friendly CSR, its always better to speak directly with the "Technical Manager" or "Chief Technician." ALWAYS LOG THE DATE / TIME / NAMES WHEN YOU HAVE A CATVI CONTACT WITH THE CABLE OPERATOR. You'll never know when that log will be needed to substantiate your claim of interference.

Finally... ("Hey! Ya wanna use honey or vinegar?")

Cable TV operators really want to resolve service problems, especially CATVI signal leakage. It is usually just a matter of finding the "right person." As usual, develop your skills and resources, then share them with your fellow hams, and your cable TV operator!
