Minutes Board Meeting July 4, 1992

The July Board Meeting was called to order at 9:35 am by Bob, AF6C, Vice President. The following board members were absent: WA6VKZ, WA3JPG,

and K6KAA.

The Treasurer reported \$691.32 in checking and \$1,068.52 in savings. All debts related to Field Day have been paid.

The Membership Chairman reported that the club now has 120 paid members. Bob, AF6C, commented that this is the largest the club has been since the early 1980's.

The Activities Chairman announced that he is in possession of a new AEA PK-232 which is being offered for a club raffle. After at least 400 tickets are sold, the winning ticket will be drawn.

Old Business

Member at Large Ken, W6HHC, announced the preliminary number of contacts that the club made at Field Day: 75 Phone - 294, 40 CW - 200, 40 Phone - 110, 20 CW - 541, 20 Phone - 555, 15 Phone - 840, 10 Novice - 232, OSCAR - 80, 2 Phone - 74, 6 Phone - 13, Packet - 41, 220 - 0, 440 - 1. A total of 2950 contacts were made and with bonus points Ken estimated our score at 7,460 points.

Bob, AF6C, directed the Secretary to write thank you letters to the Red Cross for the use of their lighting trailer

CRYSTAL CONTROLLED

Over the past week I've had a chance to monitor the VHF "Crystal" seismic monitor using my PRO-2023 Radio Shack scanner. Let me share with you some of the observations I've noticed while listening to the aftershocks of the recent Landers and Big Bear earthquakes. Since I have no technical data on the "Crystal" system, the comments I'm presenting are to excite others into a new SWL hobby (Seismic Wave Listening)! When and if more data is available on "Crystal" and other seismic radio monitors we will keep you abreast of it in RF.

For those of you who have not monitored "Crystal" it normally transmits a steady audio tone somewhere near I KHz. When seismic activity occurs the tone wavers around the center frequency. The shift of frequency appears to relate to the amplitude of the activity. The monitor seems very sensitive and responds to very small events. The audio tones seem to have an upper and lower tone limit where the system saturates. During events near magnitude 4 the tone saturates fairly rapidly between the two tone limits sounding almost similar to an HF RTTY transmission.

Twice I've been monitoring when the tone appeared to saturate for a period of a second or two at one limit then rapidly switch to the other limit. Both times ground movement was felt in the shack a few seconds after the slow limiting tones started. These shocks were reported at magnitudes 5.2 and 5.5.

While "Crystal" can't predict earthquakes or really give you any substantial warning of a quake coming (no warning if the epicenter is closer to you than the monitor) it does offer a chance to learn more about our unsteady ground.

I'm interested in any one else who has observations on "Crystal", or was monitoring when the magnitude 7.4 struck during Field Day. I've been thinking of attaching a phase-lock-loop circuit to the output and monitor it on a computer. Until Field Day Sunday monitoring "Crystal" was not very exciting - just a steady tone with an occasional small warble. Let's hope it returns to that mode soon!

By the way, these monitors are very low power and a good antenna is needed. The signal is horizontally polarized so a similarly polarized receiving antenna will help by 3 db.

For the frequency of "Crystal" and some of the other seismic monitor transmitters in the Southern California please ask Bob, WB6IXN or me at the next meeting.


