The Prez Sez:


A very troubling situation has cropped up in the last few weeks "to wit" the Orange County

Club Activities Planned for 1999

Get out your calendar and reserve the dates for the following activities

April 10,11. Baker to Vegas Challenge Cup Relay Race.

Approximately 210 running teams from law enforcement agencies nation wide will participate in this 120 mile relay race through the California and Nevada Desert. The race begins 18 miles north of Baker and proceeds north over Ibex Pass to Shoshone then on to Pahnimp Nevada, up the mountains through Mountain springs and down to Las Vegas, ending at the Rio Resort and Casino. The race is broken up into 20 legs, varying in length from 4.8 to 1.1 miles. As amateurs, we provide coarse wide communications with fin radios, packet radios and GPS APRS displays.

April 23-26 The Not So Dx-pedition, El Mirage Dry Lake.

This is a fun camp out where we bring our radios, antennas, masts etc. Set up a station of choice and operate to your hearts desire. Enjoy the group meals and top it all off with a camp fire get together before you crawl into the sleeping bag

June 26,27 Annual Amateur Radio Field Day.

Hams throughout US and Canada set up temporary stations operating under emergency conditions, many using emergency power. The goal of Field Day is to contact as many stations as possible during the 24 hour period. It prepares you for the day when disaster strikes and you are called on to do your part as a ham.

July 9-25. Orange County Fair

Each year we help operate an amateur booth at the Fair. The purpose is to acquaint the public with what we do and encourage them to develop an interest in ham radio.

August 7 Annual California Classic.

California Classic is an equestrian event that takes place at Ernie Howlett Park in Palos Verdes Hills. It is a driving event with entries from the western part of the US. Hams are needed to provide communications throughout the coarse to report accidents and injuries to drivers or horses.

October 15. Club Auction

Our October meeting is an Auction where members and guests can bring their preowned goodies to exchange for cash to the highest bidder.

November 13. La Palma Days Parade

Hams provide communications along the parade route to help Que. up the floats and report any spectator problems.
