

OLD BIZ:

- Ken-W6HHC volunteered to be editor in July. Kristin-K6PEQ volunteered to be newsletter editor in the month of August,
- Kristin-K6PEQ reported that the OCARC was planning to staff the Ham Radio Booth at the Orange Count Fair on Wednesday July 12th and Saturday July 29th.
