Q. Who can apply?

A. Everyone can apply for any of these positions

On April 1 2007, a new group of volunteers will start a two-year adventure, to serve ARRL members, Amateur Radio operators, and other groups: i.e. family radio, react, and CERT.

My current board has successfully completed two years and is welcome to apply for their current position or for a different position.

The election of a new section manager was advertised in QST and I was the successful candidate for another two years. I once again have made the commitment to assist the amateur radio community and to serve the community. It has always been my policy to open all positions within the orange section cabinet. The field organization is the responsibility of the section manager to recruit, deploy members of his team to aid local hams and others, and to maximize our enjoyment of the hobby. If you are interested in any of the cabinet positions please see below:

• The ARRL field organization: why do we need this organization?

The members are the ARRL, with this in mind; the field organization provides a valuable service to the local members and feedback to headquarters.

Although the buck stops with the Section Manager, the station-level appointees and program functions listed above are normally managed by a "cabinet" appointee called a **Section official**, under delegated authority of the SM. For example, the <u>Section Traffic Manager</u> (STM) manages the <u>National Traffic System</u> activity in the section, and appoints <u>Net Managers</u> (NM) and <u>Official Relay Stations</u>. Similarly, the <u>Section Emergency Coordinator</u> (SEC) implements the section's <u>ARES</u> plan and appoints <u>District ECs</u>, <u>ECs</u> and <u>Official Emergency Stations</u>. There's also an <u>Official Observer Coordinator</u>, <u>Technical Coordinator</u>, <u>Affiliated Club Coordinator</u>, <u>Public Information Coordinator</u> and <u>State Government Liaison</u>. After you've gained experience as a station-level appointee, perhaps you'll find yourself in one of these leadership roles.

Sign up for an official ARRL appointment! There's a place for everybody: New ham or veteran, young or old, Novice or Extra, athlete, couch potato, or tech weenie.  - A. Yes, during your term of service you are required to be a member of the ARRL, exception to this is an assistant emergency coordinator who works under the EC. (This person could be with an agency, react team, CERT, neighborhood watch group etc)

Applications must be in by March 19, 2007 for review by current Assistant Section Managers and me.

Decisions will be made the week of March 23.

The applicant will then be contacted and ready to begin on April 1, 2007. We will arrange for a Getacquainted meeting sometime soon after April 1.





It was noted that several board members will miss the April general meeting since the B2V activities begin Friday April 20 thru Sunday April 22.

- Santa Barbara Field Day Trailer -Willie-N8WP and Kristin-K6PEQ reported that the Santa Barbara Radio Club is going to be conducting a "silent auction" on a trailer loaded with an 80-ft motorized crankup tower. The board approved a motion to submit a bid for this trailer/tower for \$1,200 + any pledges received from members during the March General Meeting. This expense will be also voted on by the membership at the March General meeting. It is hoped that storage for this trailer can be obtained from Bob W6ZPL.
