OCARC November 15th, 2013 General Meeting Minutes

The OCARC General Meeting was held at the Red Cross Complex on November 15th 2013. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm. There were 31 people including 3 visitors in attendance. As is the normal plan of action we started the meeting with the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance.

President Nicholas quickly transitioned us to a video of the Ballad of the Green Berets, in commemoration of Veterans Day which was celebrated earlier in the week.

Several announcements were made from various parties including:

The Field Day results released by ARRL this month showed that we were the 2nd highest scoring team in the country. Based on that news Nicholas declared our FD a spectacular success. Listed below are the scores ...

Thanks to Wayne W6IRD for chamfering of the tower pins. This should help out greatly during our next Field Day event.

Nicholas also had a demonstration of a Geophone device for measuring vibration and earth movement. This device demonstration was very appropriate since our guest speaker Doug- W6FKX was talking about the 1933 Long Beach earthquake. Doug is a professional geologist and professor of Geology at Long Beach City College.

On Friday March 10th 1933 at 5:54pm a 6.4 magnitude earthquake shook along what is called the Newport/Inglewood fault. There are various accounts of the number of deaths that occurred but several sources place the number at over 100 killed.

On the Intensity scale this earthquake measure as a level 8 for Long Beach and much of Orange County and caused over \$40 million dollars damage (1933 dollars so would be much higher amount today.)

The property damage was most noticeable in the number of school buildings which collapsed. Because of all the school building collapses the California Legislature quickly passed the Field Act by April of 1933. This legislation requires that school building be designed and constructed to be earthquake resistant. It is estimated that the law adds 15% to the construction cost of new schools.

Doug provided us with a hands on experiment involving a cup of sand, a cup of water and several coins. First we instructed to place the coins upright in the sand and then simulated a mild earthquake. Invariably the coins would then tip over. Next we lightly wetted the sand and compacted it. This created a much better foundation environment for our coin buildings allowing them to withstand much more shaking. Finally, we saturated our sand and built our buildings one last time. With saturated sand our buildings tended to sink into the sand. Since many of the soils in Southern California are not bedrock materials but instead more of the nature of the sand in our cups then this was a painful reminder of the dangers that we can expect in a large earthquake event.

As a follow up to Doug's presentation there was a "history minute" presented by Tim N6GP about the Ham Radio response to the Long Beach earthquake. For example, well known ham W6AM – Don Wallace operated from the

yard of his residence in Long Beach helping to pass messages to the outside world.

Also, a visitor to our club mentioned that it was his understand that the Long Beach Earthquake and large scale flooding in the Midwest the same year were important factors in the ARRL establishing Field Day as an annual practice event for operating outside under emergency conditions such as our earthquakes and the flooding that the Midwest had experienced.

After a short break the meeting was reconvened and annual officer elections were held. The results of the elections for the 2014 board is President – Nicholas Haban – AF6CF, Vice President - Tim Goeppinger – N6GP, Secretary – Tim Millard – KJ6NGF, Treasure – Ken Konechy–W6HHC, Activities – Paul Gussow – W6GMU, Membership – Kris Jacob – KC6TOD, Publicity – Robbie Robinson – KB6CJZ, Tech – Bob Eckweiler – AF6C, Director at Large – Doug Britton – W6FKX, and Director at Large – Greg Bohning – W6ATB.

Also, the members approved two spending items regarding the annual Christmas Party. It was agreed to spend up to \$1,500 on raffle prizes — with the assumption that after raffle ticket sales the club is only likely to be spending about \$600 (\$1,500 - \$900 = \$600) on the drawing prizes. A second measure was passed to spend up to \$400 on gift basket prizes for the women attending the party.



See information following On VE Exam Day Bring the Following Items

- A legal photo ID (driver's license, passport) or two other forms of non-photo ID; e.g., birth certificate, social security card, library card, utility bill or other business correspondence with name of the examinee as it appears on the Form 605 and current mailing address.
- 2. Your Social Security Number (SSN) or FCC-issued Federal Registration Number (FRN).
- 3. If applicable, the original and a photocopy of your current Amateur Radio license and any Certificates of Successful Completion of Examination (CSCE) you may have from previous exam session. (Photocopies will not be returned.)
- 4. Two number two pencils with erasers, and a pen.
- 5. A calculator with memory erased and formulas cleared (no iPhones, iPads, etc.).
- 6. Test Fee: \$15.00 (cash or check).

If you fail an element and wish to retake it, we are required to charge an additional test fee. If you pass an element, we typically offer and encourage you to take the next element. We do not charge an additional test fee for this and it gives you the opportunity to see what the next exam element is like!


CW Lives!!!! and

Many hams are familiar with the "waterfall" display that is used with some digital modes like PSK-31. There is a digital SDR group of hams (HPSDR) that are using the waterfall display to "see" all modes like: SSB and CW as well as digital.

The photo below is taken on 10M during the recent CQWWDX CW-SWEEPSTAKES contest. Each vertical line you see "in the waterfall" photo is another CW QSO occurring during the contest.

OCARC Board Meeting Minutes

for

November 9, 2013

The OCARC Board meeting was held at the JägerHaus Restaurant, 2525 East Ball Road, Anaheim, and called to order to order by President Nicholas Haban AF6CF on Saturday, November 9, 2013. Called to order at 8:13 am and all directors except Doug – W6FKX, Bob – AF6C and Jay – KI6WZU were present. Club member George – N6VNI was also in attendance.

DIRECTOR REPORTS

Pres – Nicholas AF6CF has read the latest newsletter and congratulated the editor and writers for a job well done.

Treas – Ken W6HHC has filed the required FTB-199N form with the State Franchise Tax Board. The club financial position is still in fine shape even after our Reunion party and the various submitted expenses, with approximately \$6,023 in the bank. Also, Ken noted that the club netted more on the Auction then recent years. This was particular due to the generous donations from the members.

Sec – Tim KJ6NGF presented a piece of mail sent to the club from Radio City, Inc. offering a "Ham Radio Starter Kit" which include a TDX 2m/440 radio, Gordon West Technician Class book, FCC Part 97 Rule Book, and Reference Guide for the radio.

Publicity – Kris KC6TOD reports that club brochures have been restocked at Ham Radio Outlet.

D.A.L. – Paul W6GMU reports that mugs will be available at the November General Meeting for those who previously ordered. Additional mugs can be ordered at that time. **No other Directors reports were presented.**

Old Business:

- 1.) Newsletter Editors: Dec –KC6TOD; Jan AF6CF; Feb W6HHC; Mar KJ6NGF; Apr AF6C.
- **2.) General Meeting Entertainment –** November Doug W6FKX on Long Beach Earthquake plus Ham Radio response. December Dinner, Jan in planning, Feb attempting to rebook Arduino speaker.
- 3.) Field Day 2014 start putting this into planning mode no change to report at this time.
- 4.) Field Day Repairs
 - **a.)** Tower Pins Wayne W6IRD has completed pin chamfering. Thanks Wayne.
 - **b.**) **15M Beam Balun** Bob AA6PW reported that the whole balun was damaged (lossy after many years of exposure to the weather) and had to be trashed. Bob AF6C will make a new coaxial balun and design a connector.
 - **c.**) **15M Beam Broken Element** Ken W6HHC held a work party using Bob AF6C and Nicholas AF6CF to put the parts together on November 2nd and then test the beam. That work party discovered that new tube needed to be ordered to replace the element end. They have been ordered and are being shipped at this time.

- 5.) Pay Pal Account Takeover to full ownership of OCARC –.PayPal rules have not made this easy. They seem to require that the account be under an individual's Social Security number and name, however that is exactly the issue that we are trying to avoid because if something happens to that person then access to the account can become blocked. The club has a corporate identity and tax id and it would be best if the account were established that way. Might require setting up a new account with PayPal to make this all work correctly. In addition, the "free" button available from PayPal for web sites is limited to a single item at a single price...a "shopping cart" arrangement appears to cost money. Board talked about other options then PayPal. It was suggested that we contact member Jim Shryne N6DHZ to see if he has some wisdom in dealing with PayPal since he was successful in establishing its use for the District convention.
- **6.) Elections Committee report** The current list of proposed officers on the website is correct. At our November General meeting we will ask the membership if there are additional nominees. At that point a final slate will be defined and elections can proceed at that time.
- 7.) Xmas Party prizes and advertising At the previous Board Meeting it was voted to spend \$600 on radio raffle prizes. The board passed a motion (that amended that earlier decision) to spend \$1500 on radio prizes with the idea that enough tickets will be sold to cover up to \$900 of that cost, so our potential loss if any should be no more than \$600. The prize committee (Paul, Nicholas, George, Kris and Doug) will go shopping with the intent of purchasing an HF rig in the \$600 range and a mobile UHF/VHF in the \$200 range. That will leave another \$700 in additional prizes for the drawings.
- **8.) Speakers for 2014** January speaker still not resolved, February it is looking promising to have our Arduino friend, March looking for another Wayne Overbeck presentation.

New Business:

- 1. **Xmas Party cover price discussion** The dinner price is \$29.95 however at that price the menu did not include the Potato Pancake. After discussion the board agreed to subsidize the approximately \$2.00 additional amount and offer the full menu that members had last year which includes the pancake. The main agreement among the board members is that the clubs finances have been in great shape this last year. While it is the intention of the club to always carry some reserves the board feels that it only makes sense to return those funds deemed excess to the membership in some form, whether that is additional prizes at meetings and parties or subsidizing a portion of the Christmas dinner cost
- 2. No December Board Meeting Board members agreed to not hold a December board meeting.
- 3. **2014 Honorary Club Members** Board agreed to keep the 2014 honorary club members list the same with Gordon and Suzy West, Janet and Chip Margelli, and Tom Woodard so honored.
- 4. **Audit Committee** The President appointed Tim KJ6NGF, Bob AF6C, and Doug W6FKX to serve as an "audit committee" to review the OCARC 2013 finances.

Good of the Club

 The Club President asked that board members offer their suggestions during the coming weeks for nominees whom he should consider for the 2013 Good of the Club award.
