

NEW BIZ:



A Tour of W6FPS's Shack


Before I take you on a tour of the shack, let me give you a summary of my Ham Radio history. When I was born my father was a commercial fisherman. For communications, his boat was equipped with a transmitter that was limited to the bands that the commercial fishing boats used when operating off the coast of California and Mexico. The receiver onboard was a Hallicrafters Model S-38A which covered from the broadcast frequencies up to 30 megacycles. In the early 1950s, the price on albacore dropped and my father quit fishing for a living. The receiver somehow ended up in my bedroom and I became interested in shortwave listening. In the '50s, the world was a much bigger place and to hear broadcasts from Europe or Asia was simply amazing. Since then, I have been interested in radio. I was first licensed as a novice, WN6FPS, in the spring of 1963. For my novice station the S-38A was used along with a 60 watt CW EICO 723 transmitter that I had built from a kit. At that time the transmitter kit, at \$68.00, was the most expensive thing that I had ever bought. My novice license expired in 1964 and I wasn't licensed again until 1988 as KB6YUD. Other calls that I have had are N6SUV and AD6NI. When I received my Extra Class ticket I applied for a vanity call and luckily could get my novice call minus the N, hence W6FPS. So, enough about history, now on with the tour.

As you can see from the accompanying photo, my radio room is as small a size as Ham Shacks go. The entire shack is in a 4' x 4' closet. What it lacks in space I have made up for with clutter. A list of the equipment in the shack, by functions: my transmitters include five homebrew QRP rigs & an EICO 723(not the original one that I had built as a kid); The only receiver is a Hallicrafters S-38A, sadly not the one from my father; there are three transceivers, an ICOM 746PRO, an Elecraft KX3 and a Baofeng UV-5R. I also have a Heathkit SB-201 amplifier that I picked up at a TRW swap meet to which I am going to add a few mods in the near future. My shack and equipment are minimal but sufficient for my needs.

I enjoy operating CW (wish I was more fluent) so I have a small key collection: one bug, two iambic and five straight keys. I also like to build antennas but, due to antenna restrictions (XYL imposed) they are inconspicuous. I have a trapped vertical in the backyard for 20 & 40 Meters and in the attic, hidden from view, 10 & 20 meter dipoles and a 10 meter moxon. I constructed two three element yagis, one for 10 and one for 20 meters, and a 10, 15 and 20 meter Hexbeam that I can use for portable operations. The yagis and Hexbeam can be easily set up in the driveway for a weekend events. See the photo for the 20 meter yagi on my homebrew telescopic mast. Can you see the neighbors shaking their heads?

The shack has shelving full of reference material, power supplies, dummy loads, antenna tuners, tools, and a recently purchased Dell computer that I have dedicated solely to Ham Radio.

On-air time is limited but I try to make time for a few of my favorite events, i.e., ARRL Sweepstakes, California QSO Party, monthly SKCC SKS & WES, and the ARRL 10 Meter Contest. I would like the tour to continue but I should get up in the attic to string a few more dipoles.


