Happy New Year everyone! It is going to be a so-so year on the HF bands, as we expect to double the number of days without sunspots from the 104 days we had last year. The average trough of the sunspot cycle has around 500 days without sunspots and we just have 136 so far this cycle. Taking advantage of the FT8 digital mode is a good way to boost your reach during these tough conditions.

Activities Director Ron Mudry W6WG is hard at work planning our entry in Winter Field Day on the weekend of Jan 27 and 28. With the convenient location in Huntington Beach, many members are participating, and we will have at least 2 transmitters on the air. Storm clouds are brewing over some of the recent actions by the ARRL Board of Directors. It is a long story, but the ARRL Board voted to censure our SW Division Director Dick Norton, N6AA over some comments he made at the Visalia DX convention. Furthermore, there is a proposal by the Board at their meeting on Jan. 19th to add the unelected President and Vice Presidents as voting members to the Board, effectively stacking the deck for votes in their favor. I hope the ARRL Board reverses course before their meeting and gets things back on track.

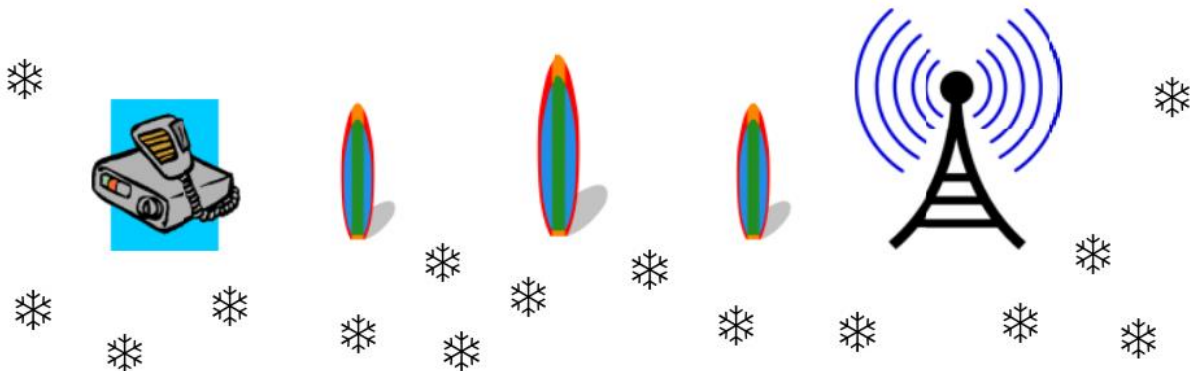

Open Letter by Wayne Overbeck, N6NB to the ARRL Board of Directors

Dear Members of the Board:

As a former four-term vice director and ARRL member since 1957, I never before considered submitting a letter like this to the Board of Directors. However, the board now faces the most serious threat to its credibility since the incentive licensing controversy 50 years ago. In fact, the current crisis is more serious because so many of those who are concerned about recent and proposed board actions are prominent and highly respected leaders of amateur radio.

I believe the board must act quickly to reaffirm its commitment to democratic principles if it is to avoid long-term damage to ARRL's effectiveness and its endowment.

The new code of conduct, which is widely perceived as a gag rule to silence directors who may disagree with ARRL policy, must be abolished. It cannot be saved by wordsmithing or spin-doctoring. Directors must be free to express their views on all matters to the members who elected them, even if what they say could be deemed to disparage ARRL itself. Their primary loyalty must be to the membership. The code of conduct is fundamentally at odds with that principle.

Moreover, the board needs to reaffirm its commitment to free elections. No committee should be allowed to disqualify board candidates who meet the written qualifications for the position. The membership must be free to elect any legally qualified candidate, regardless of his or her stance on any issue or any undefined "conflict of interest." A committee that can remove candidates from the ballot with seeming arbitrariness reminds a lot of us of a "guardian council" that disqualifies potential candidates for their lack of ideological purity in some countries. It has no place in a democratic organization. Equally undemocratic is the proposal to allow ARRL memberships to be arbitrarily revoked. That could also be used to undercut free elections. And the recent proposal to dilute elected directors' votes by giving a board vote to persons not elected by the members is still another action that would undermine ARRL's status as a democratic organization.

Above all, the board must bring sunshine to its governance process. Frankly, during the many board meetings I attended, too many things happened that would never withstand public scrutiny. The minutes rarely provided a complete picture of what really happened at those meetings. The best solution is to open board meetings to any member who wishes to attend. When ARRL was established and its governing documents were written to allow closed board meetings, sunshine laws were rare even for government agencies. The federal Freedom of Information Act was not

enacted until 1967 and the Government in the Sunshine Act came even later. Now we live in a different time. Today the public and ARRL members expect even private membership associations to be far more open and transparent than they did when ARRL was founded.

In short, I believe the board must work to restore public confidence by recognizing full freedom of speech for directors, assuring free elections and opening board meetings to members. It's been very heartening to see the huge outpouring of support for an open and democratic ARRL. Now the board needs to address these issues..

In addition, the board should reconsider the recent censure of director Norton. His alleged offense was nothing more than making members aware of the existence of the new code of conduct. After hearing him discuss this issue in two venues, I believe his presentations were not only accurate but also very much in the best interests of ARRL and its members. He deserves praise, not censure, for supporting members' right to know.

The January OCARC Board meeting was held at the Marie Callender's Restaurant at 1821 N. Grand Ave in Santa Ana on January 6, 2018. Meeting called to Order: 8:10 am.

- ☐ **Vice President** – Dan KI6X and Corey KE6YHX were welcomed to the new OCARC Board. No current report. (see Entertainment below)
- ☐ **Secretary** – Jim AF6N - No current report.
- ☐ **Membership** – Bob AF6C – Blizzard conditions in Boston grounded Bob in Boston.
- ☐ **Treasurers Report** – Ken W6HHC presented copies of the OCARC Financial Audit Report for 2017. The report was audited, accepted, and endorsed by Tim N6GP, Ken W6HHC, Tim N6TMT, and Jim, AF6N on January 4, 2018. Results of the accounting reported a balance between OCARC Inflows and Outflows. For the year, the club reported a financial gain of \$478.33 that included an income of \$1,058.00 from sales of equipment.

Ken also reported that the transfer of funds from the Orange County Credit Union to Wells Fargo is in process and all future checks will be written on the Wells Fargo account.

- ☐ **Activities** – Ron W6WG reported completing a survey of club activities that have been reported in the RF Newsletter during the most recent 10 years. The survey will serve as a source of ideas for upcoming club events.
Ron also reported Winter Field Day planning. He has prepared an operator/equipment listing that will be used to confirm availabilities. And, he distributed maps of the Ocean View School Dist. site for planning use. Two possible guest operators are Bill K6WHP for CW and Endaf N6UTC for Satellite.
- ☐ **Publicity** – Tim N6TMT reported he received no response to his email regarding an uncashed \$30 check to the Boy Scouts. He delivered the activity raffle wheel to Ron W6WG and will contact Dan N6PEQ for the tri-fold brochure supply.
- ☐ **Technical** – Kenan KR6J – Absent, no current report.
- ☐ **Director at Large** – Clem W0MEC – No current report.

- **Club Historian:** Corey KE6YHX reported that the M-Disc Archival DVDR was presented as a gift to the Santa Ana Library History Room Archives. Corey signed an Organizational Deed of Gift naming OCARC as the intellectual property rights controller. He reported the list of databases including the club roster histories. Surprisingly, the 1959 OCARC roster included 202 members.
- **Winter Field Day** - Ron W6WG reported the Huntington Beach site has been confirmed but that power supply is still a pressing concern. The club KW battery is available. Greg W6ATB will bring his 600 watt generator but recommends that the club acquire a small generator in the future.

We appear to have enough operators available for two or possibly three stations (Activities report above). FT8 as well as RTTY and PSK were recommended for the digital station. Currently antennas include Ron’s 3 element yagi and his 40 meter Vee Beam, Greg’s 3 band Vertical, and Jim’s homebrew 20 meter vertical as a backup.

NEW BUSINESS:

- **85TH Anniversary Celebration:** September was suggested for a reunion at which former members could be invited to attend. Jim AF6N volunteered to investigate availability and cost of commemorate mugs with Paul W6GMU, Café Press, Vista Print, etc. Ron W6WG will investigate the cost of OCARC polo shirts with I Initial and other vendors.
- **June Field Day:** June Field Day was discussed with consensus to use the Buena Park facility again and consider the Winter Field Day location as a backup. An announcement will be made at the January General Meeting, requesting volunteers for Field Day chairman and intention to hold a planning meeting in late February or early March.
- **Lifetime Achievement Award:** Tim N6GP suggested an award be established to honor a current or former member who has served the club exceptionally over time. The award would not be granted annually as is the Good of the Club Award but, would be granted to recognize a legacy of exceptional long term service. Several suggestions included, naming the award after the first recipient, a dedicated web page history, an engraved plaque, etc. Corey KE6YHX, Ken W6HHC, and Bob AF6C were named as a committee to investigate the proposal.
- **Mimi’s \$5 coupons:** Mimi’s Café presented OCARC with a supply of \$5 coupons as a thank you for our Christmas dinner business. After a couple of successful tests, the board has recommended that Tim N6GP attempt to negotiate a trade for a regular gift card that would be available to offer dinner for out of town meeting speakers.
- **GOOD OF THE CLUB:** We regret to report learning of the passing of Larry Hoffman K6LDC. Larry was a very innovative and popular OCARC past president. The club extends our sincere condolences to his family.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30 am in honor of K6LDC (SK).
