



OCARC BOARD MEETING MINUTES 2023-11-04

The eleventh Board Meeting of the year was on Saturday, November 4, 2023. The meeting was called to order by president pro-tem, Nicholas Haban AF6CF at 8:20 AM PDT. Eight (8) directors were present for a quorum. The vice president and secretary were absent. Membership chairman Corey KE6YHX is acting as secretary pro-tem. Twenty-one (21) topics were brought to the Board this morning, including four (4) Director Reports, and seventeen (17) discussion items. Two (2) motions were carried, including adjournment.

Director Reports

•President:

-October Auction: Nicholas AF6CF reports the auction went remarkably well. Nicholas commends Tim G. N6GP and Corey KE6YHX on the auction management services they provided, as well as support from AJ KN6WNO. We had a net profit for the Club of \$846.10.

•Treasurer:

-Tim G. N6GP reports our finances are better than a couple months ago. We had total inflows of \$7,260 and total outflows of \$4,635 for a net total of \$2,625 for 2023.

-Tim G. N6GP makes a motion that we put a minimum of \$5,000 into a Wells Fargo CD in January. The motion is seconded, and carries unanimously for the Board Members present at 8:35 AM PDT.

-Our treasurer, Tim G. N6GP, will be absent for the November General Meeting. Tom C. W6ETC volunteers to carry the treasurer briefcase for the meeting.

•Activities: Our activities chairman, Tom W6ETC, sorts-out the prizes for the future year-end meeting opportunity drawings.

-November General Meeting: Tom W6ETC reports on some important donations for the opportunity drawing, and some of them may carry-over to the Christmas Party. Nicholas AF6CF has another potential prize for this drawing.

-Christmas Party: AJ KN6WNO is holder of the Christmas Party opportunity drawing grand prize. He also proposes an HT that can be purchased for this drawing.

For Your Ham Radio Bucket List: Operating from the Titan Missile Museum Discone Antenna By Tim Goeppinger, N6GP

Late last summer my wife Edna asked me if I wanted to go to a quinceanera (big 15th birthday party) for one of her cousin's daughters in Tucson. I asked when, and she said the last weekend in October, with the main event on Friday night. I remembered that is the weekend of the big CQ WorldWide SSB contest. I usually dabble in it a bit, but for me it ranks a distant 3rd behind the CQWW RTTY and CW contests. I had an idea – what if we combined the trip with a visit to the Titan Missile Museum, with its huge discone antenna, and operate in the contest for an hour or so on Saturday? Maybe other antennas could be brought along for portable use elsewhere in the Tucson area.




Figure 1 -- KB9RLW Spectrum Plot showing SWR in Yellow

In the weeks prior to our trip, I decided to watch a few Youtube videos about this discone antenna. One excellent one is by Kevin Loughlin KB9RLW video:

I was trying to see if I was setting my expectations a little too high for what this antenna can do. I learned that it is essentially a broadband vertical with NO GAIN. KB9RLW's video showed a spectrum plot from his VNA antenna analyzer, that was a little disheartening. Many bands have an SWR of 2 to 3, due to the lack of maintenance on the antenna since its installation in 1963. After seeing this, I decided to bring along my larger Kenwood TS-590SG, which has a built in antenna tuner.

We decided to take the tour of the museum, which is quite a sobering and interesting look into the Cold War era. This site was the only one not demolished, and was allowed to remain for historical purposes under the SALT Treaty with the Soviets. The amount of tax dollars that must have gone into this silo is astounding. 35 feet under ground, the control room was totally isolated from the ground with huge springs. The 760-ton door covering the silo could be opened in 20 seconds. The tour guide walked us through a simulated launch. They had only 3 minutes to fire the missile after they had been given orders. 4 man crews ran the place 24/7 from 1963 to 1987.

Following our 45-minute museum tour we returned to the gift shop where they had a special notebook for hams wanting to operate. I signed their log, read the rules, and signed the release waiver. I then exchanged my driver's license for a key that opens the lockbox where the end of the coax is located.

We drove to the part of the parking lot that has this lock box, along with a nice picnic table to operate from. It was a little warm, about 85 degrees, so I put on some sunscreen. I had driven by this site a half a dozen times on the way to Mexico, and I was excited to try this antenna out! I unlocked the box, set up my rig and battery and got on the air.

This antenna was constructed by Collins Radio in 1962 or 1963, and stands 70 feet tall. Originally, it was 2 antennas in one – one part that covers 6 to 30 MHz, the other below 6 MHz. Currently, it is set for the 6 to 30 MHz selection.

When I first turned on my radio, it seemed that the discone was receiving very well. I could hear Europeans on 10 and 15m phone quite easily. My first QSO was with IR6T in Italy on 15m SSB. It took maybe 3 or 4 calls in the contest pileups to get through, so I certainly was not a big signal. Then worked Cayman Island, followed by Portugal, Spain and Argentina on 10m. I looked at my phone to see if there were any spots for the Russian A25R from Botswana. Saw that they were on 12m FT8. Tuned my rig there, hit the antenna tune button, and I started to call them. After about 4 calls they came back with a -03 report. Switched to 15m and worked them there too. It was

ironic that I worked Russians from a facility that targeted them for destruction a mere 40 years ago.

I draped a QST magazine over my rig to shield it from the direct sunlight. Looked on 17m FT8 to see what was there, and found the German T2C DXpedition on Tuvalu Island in the South Pacific. They were easy to get. After about 75 minutes of operating time, I finished off with QSOs with France and Bonaire on 15m SSB. Like I said before, I didn't feel like a big gun, but this antenna performed very well.


Where else can you drive up with your car, and hook up to a fantastic, historic antenna like this? This is truly a Ham Radio Bucket List experience that everyone should try to experience. It is about an 8-hour drive away from Orange County, and would be a great trip for some of us in the club to take.

I am grateful to the Titan Missile Museum and the Green Valley Amateur Radio Club for providing this unique radio experience to the ham radio community.



Old Navy Blimp Hangar Burns at USMC Helicopter Base Site in Tustin

Ken W6HHC and Bob AF6C



For many years, the OCARC operated the summer Field Days at the now deactivated USMCAS(H) helicopter base in Tustin. The Tustin base was originally opened by the U.S. Navy to operate blimps during World War II to hunt for submarines. A couple of our former members, Art Sheldon K7ZE (formerly WA6LHB / AD6B) and Chris Winter (W6KFW) used to work in the hangars when the base was active and the hangars were then used to house the helicopter flight-simulators. In 1973, Art was the one who obtained the "green light from the U.S. Marine Corp" to operate FD on the Helicopter Air Station base for many Field Days. Originally, the OCARC operated FD from the old MARS station area. Later, the club operated FD from the south field near the south hangar. (It's the north hangar that burned on 2023-Nov-05.) Bob AF6C (then WB6QNU) was the club Prez back in 1973. Art K7ZE now lives up in the Las Vegas area.
