



May Speaker – Tim Goeppinger, N6GP Titan Missile Museum with Discone & Exploring 6 Meters



Writing a bio about myself is a little egotistical, but here goes.


I was first licensed in 1976 with the novice callsign WN6OWD. I have held all five classes of licenses, finishing with Extra in 1987. My other calls were WB6OWD, K6GEP, and finally N6GP. I have been a member of OCARC since around 1988 and have served on the Board continuously since 2012.

I worked as a Software engineer for about 25 years at Northrop, Rockwell, and Boeing, and now provide IT support for a school and church.

I have tried many of the facets of ham radio over the years, including contesting, DXing, and public service. I helped do communications for the Rose Parade for about 15 years when that was going on. I have worked 322 of the possible 340 DXCC Countries. One of my passions since 2010 has

been participating in VHF contests as a rover. In 2011-12, some friends and I did two expeditions to Anacapa Island. I enjoyed the ARRL "National Parks On the Air" (NPOTA) year during 2016 and hope to get active on POTA.

This month, I will be giving two different 30-minute talks. The first one is timely because we are at the beginning of the Sporadic E 6 Meter summer season. You will learn how easy it is to get on 6m and how you can make QSOs on 6m. Second will be an interesting, but sobering, topic of the Titan Missile Museum in southeastern Arizona. The highlight will be my discussion of the Collins Discone antenna, which is there for all visiting hams to use.

The Polynomial Puzzle:

Note that the sign alternates with each term!

The Polynomial Puzzle Answer & Winner:

The polynomial simplifies to 0', Zero, Nada....

All that talk about odd and even integers are just smoke and mirrors.

Look at the last three terms of the polynomial:

$$(x+x)(x+y)(x+z)$$

The 24th term (x - x) calculates to zero, thus the whole polynomial is zero since zero times any number is zero.




