# February Speaker Spotlight

## Doug Millar, K6JEY

### “Test Gear for Hams in 2026”



**Doug, K6JEY** (formerly KN6JEY, WB0NST, ZL2JEY), is a prominent amateur radio operator, educator, and expert in RF metrology and microwave communications. Licensed since 1957, he is well-known for his work in Earth-Moon-Earth (EME) communication, mentoring, and contributions to technical literature.

#### Background and Professional Life

- **Early Career:** Licensed in 1957 as KN6JEY in Redondo Beach, California.
- **Professional Background:** Holds an EdD in Educational Technology and is a semi-retired professor, often referred to as a "teacher of teachers".
- **Metrology Expert:** Served as an ARRL Technical

Advisor in Metrology and wrote the 26th chapter of the *ARRL Handbook* on Test Equipment and Measurement. He also consulted for Shafer Engineering in RF power measurement during the 1970s.

- **Mentoring and Astronomy** – Doug has taken a group of students to the Owens Valley Radio Observatory (OVRO) about once a year.

#### Amateur Radio Interests

- **EME (Moon Bounce):** Active in EME since 1990, specializing in setting up 144 MHz and 1,296 MHz stations, often operating from his driveway.
- **Microwaves & High Frequency:** Experienced in operations up to 122 GHz, including 1296MHz (starting in 1962) and modern millimeter-wave, as well as HF CW and AM.
- **Boat Anchors:** Enjoys restoring and operating older AM radio equipment.
- **Technical Contribution:** Featured on the QSO Today podcast and Ham Radio Workbench, sharing knowledge on SDR, measurement techniques, and practical station building.

Doug will be presenting various types of test equipment that you should consider for your shack. He presents many options for hams like us on a budget. Bring your volt ohm meter to try out on his calibrated resistor, and see how far you are off!

# Massive Hoard of W6ZE Hunter QSOs Discovered on POTA Website

We had no idea. Year after year OCARC has been doing impressive field days, both in Winter and in Summer. Our field day process is a well-oiled machine. Everyone knows their job in setup, operating and tear-down. Unknown to us, we were achieving something really big.

A couple weeks ago, when I was submitting our Winter Field Day log for scoring, a thought went off in my curious mind. "I wonder how many POTA QSOs we are making at our field days? I bet we have a hundred or more!", I said to myself. On a lark I created an account for W6ZE at the pota.app site. After a slight technical glitch, and some great support from the POTA website, I finally made it in.

I could not believe my eyes, and I was blown away to see 926 QSOs in our Hunter Log,, stretching all the way back to 1995 ! Furthermore, I was shocked that 80 out of our 2300 QSOs in Winter Field Day 2026 was with POTA stations!

It is certain that we have earned over a dozen awards from POTA. Do we have Worked All States? The Awards section updates only once a day, and it has not processed yet. Next month I will give a rundown on what awards we have achieved.


Figure 1 A Few QSOs from the W6ZE POTA Log

**OCARC BOARD MEETING MINUTES 2/7/2026**

Meeting held via Zoom and called to order by President, Dan KI6X at 8:20AM. Roll call resulted in all members being present except for Publicity. It was discovered afterwards that Michael's email information was in error and has now been corrected so he will receive future notifications.

Pre-meeting conversation between Joe KM6SVV and AJ W6OTO continued regarding pick up of items from K6OGO SK station in Tustin. Joe will follow up with a phone call and coordinate with AJ after the meeting is adjourned.

Treasurer, Tim N6TMT, presented the 2025 Cash Flow report via email, showing influx of cash funds exceeding outflow for the year of \$111.57. An audit of accounts will be forthcoming soon. Payment of storage fees and insurance in December was confirmed.

Membership chairman, Ron W6WG, advised 64 renewals so far this year with more continuing to arrive. 6 new members joined the club in January.

Activities Director, Corey KE6YHX, reported a purchase of \$214.34 for various different prizes for future opportunity drawings, which will also include Bioenno batteries and Baofeng UV5R mini HTs. Next drawing will be at the February 20 meeting.

Director, AJ W6OTO, reminded all to send next newsletter submissions to him asap. March editor will be Michael KO6FAR, and April will be Dave N3BKV. No volunteers yet for May.

Dave N3BKV, has completed security hardening for the remote station portal and is waiting to hear back regarding repairs (weather delays) to the radio being used for the remote station. Dave provided a quick run through of the remote updates and screen visuals that will be seen by admins and operators.

President, Dan KI6X, reminded everyone from the Monthly Planner Review to start thinking about June Field Day. Planning should start in earnest at the March meetings.

Vice-President, Tim N6GP, confirmed our guest for the February meeting is Doug K6JEY on test equipment. Doug should have with him equipment to calibrate various types of meters members could bring that require such adjustments. Tentatively, March may be about the Disneyland Radio Club and its history from Fred W0PE and others, retired Disney employees who were active in the early years. Tim now has a source for other potential programs from the Simi Valley ARC, where he is going to be presenting a program on the Titan Missile Museum.

WINTER FIELD DAY WRAP-UP: Tim N6GP, congratulated the club on what looks to be 1<sup>st</sup> place of 2100 entries in Winter Field Day. Discussion covered various aspects, including the lower 40m antennas contributing to a lower than usual score on that band (although the lower tower/antenna height did make things easier in general), and the really nice article about the club in the OC Register.

**OCARC GENERAL MEETING MINUTES 1/16/2026**

General meeting held at the American Red Cross, 600 N Park Center Dr, Santa Ana, CA was called to order at 7:05PM by Vice-President, Tim N6GP, as President, Dan KI6X, was unavailable. After the Pledge of Allegiance, introductions were held with 36 in attendance, including one visitor and one new member.
