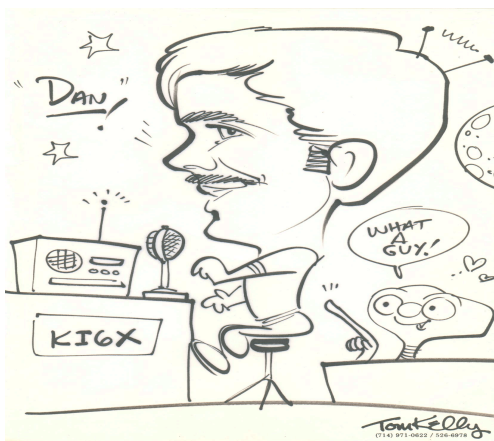

## From Da Vinci to DX: Hunting Ham Radio in Northern Italy and San Marino

My wife and I had a fast-paced trip to northern Italy in mid-April. On any trip, I always keep my eyes peeled for ham radio-related things. I did manage to find a few, not a lot. I made new discoveries while writing this article.

In Milan, we visited the Leonardo da Vinci Museum of Science and Technology, the largest science museum in Italy. An entire floor was dedicated to da Vinci, featuring models of many of his inventions. It's easy to imagine that if he were alive today, he would be a ham, like us.

Another wing focused on communications and radio, though I was a bit disappointed that amateur radio wasn't included. They did, however, have a clever interactive Morse code exhibit. There was a key connected to a speaker, and when I tapped out a message, I heard random tapping in response about 15 seconds later. At first, I thought it might be AI-generated. A couple of rooms later, I spotted another key and speaker—and then it clicked: the two stations were connected. I sent out a CQ with my call sign, but didn't receive any replies.

They had another cool exhibit demonstrating how radio waves pass through certain materials. It had a transmitter and receiver, and you could lift plates of different materials across the beam.

I made a point to visit the Santa Croce cathedral in Florence, to see the graves of many of the Who's Who of Italian historical figures – Galileo, Michelangelo, Machiavelli, Rossini, and Marconi. I thought this was Marconi's grave, but after researching this article, I found out its only a memorial to him. He is buried in Bologna.

I only spotted one ham station in Italy, and it was in the coastal town of Rimini. Looks like it has a nice SteppIR dipole with several long-boom VHF yagi beams mounted above it. While writing this article, I decided to try Google Lens on this photo. It matched with Giorgio Para, IU4CHE ! Turns out I have worked him 4 times in the last 5 years, on CW, SSB, and RTTY!

About a 45-minute bus ride from Rimini up the hill is the Republic of San Marino, which is the 5<sup>th</sup> smallest country in the world. It's about the size of the City of Orange. Unfortunately, San Marino has not signed the CEPT agreement on reciprocal licensing, so it is very difficult to obtain a license there. It's a shame, because the views of the countryside from way up on that hill will get any ham thinking what an amazing RF location that would be. Especially for VHF -oh my goodness. We visited Bologna on a Saturday, but unfortunately, the Marconi Museum and Mausoleum were closed that day. It is there that Marconi was buried. Maybe just as well that we missed it, since Marconi was not kind to radio hams, and he was an early supporter of Mussolini. Our trip was not intended to involve ham radio at all, but it was fun to stumble upon things that are related to our hobby. Maybe I will add a trip to Europe to my bucket list with the express purpose of getting on the air. How about during a VHF Contest? I can only dream.

# OCARC Reclaims Title as Winter Field Day Champs for 2026

The W6ZE team is back on top this year, following our hiatus in 2025. Previously, OCARC had established a dynasty of 7 WFD wins from 2018 thru 2024.

The weather was very much in our favor this year. We had sunny WX in the 70's, while the rest of the country was hit with an icy blast from Texas up to New England, bringing snow, freezing rain, and sleet. But – the weather did not seem to deter WFD participation. A record number of logs were turned in for 2026, 2,594 vs 2,473 for last year. Understandably, the Home category grew this year by 400 logs, with drops seen in Outdoor, Indoor and Mobile.

In our Outdoor category, we had quite a challenge from W6TRW, which outdid us in multipliers by operating on more bands, but we overcame our multiplier deficit with many more QSOs.

## Introducing the OCARC Remote Station

The Orange County Amateur Radio Club is introducing a new way for members to enjoy HF operating: the **OCARC Remote Station**. This station gives members the ability to operate a club radio remotely using the free FlexRadio SmartSDR PC software and a web browser. The goal is to make HF access easier for members who may not have antennas at home, who live with HOA restrictions or who simply want to try operating from a highly capable station setup.

Remote operation has become an increasingly practical part of amateur radio. With modern radios, secure login portals and broadband Internet connections, a station no longer has to be in the same room as the operator. The OCARC Remote Station is designed to be straightforward, you just log in, power up the radio, connect with SmartSDR and operate.

### How It Works

Once you are on-boarded for access, you will receive setup instructions for SmartSDR. After SmartSDR is installed, the basic operating process is simple:

1. Log in to the OCARC radio power portal.
2. Check the status display.
3. If the display is green, the radio is available.
4. Press the power button.
5. Wait about two minutes for the radio to come online.
6. Open SmartSDR software, select the radio and click **CONNECT**.

After the first login, the portal will remember you, making future sessions easier.

### Operating Notes

The remote station is setup with a large beam that supports operation on **20, 15 and 10 meters**. The beam is currently pointed toward Europe, making the station a useful way to explore HF propagation and DX opportunities on the higher bands.

Instructions are available for SSB, CW and FT8 operation.

As with any shared club resource, good operating practice matters. Please listen first, be courteous, avoid tying up the station unnecessarily and remember that others may be waiting to use it.

In your Email make sure to mention your name as it appears on the club member roster as well as your callsign. You will then be sent the setup instructions needed to install SmartSDR, so you can log in to the portal and begin operating.

## SO, YOU'VE NEVER BEEN TO DAYTON....

In 1952, the Dayton Amateur Radio Association (DARA) launched the Southwestern Ohio Hamvention in March of that year, at the Biltmore Hotel in downtown Dayton. Hoping for 300 attendees, they ended up with over 600. The next year, it was rebranded as the “Dayton Hamvention”. For those of us who have attended over the years, whether for work or play, it has simply been known as “Dayton”.

In the early years, it was always the last weekend in April, the weekend following the International DX Convention in California (years ago in Fresno, more recently in Visalia, and attracting more DXers to attend), which was also the same weekend as the Daylight Saving Time change. The date was changed to May in 1996. The weather is changeable that time of year, and the first year at the current location the outdoor swap meet (which grew from about 600 spaces to 2700 spaces) was a flood of mud. When the event was in April, snow was not uncommon.

In the 1960s, as the event grew, the convention moved to the Hara Arena in Trotwood, OH, which became home to “Dayton” for more than 50 years. The 1980s and 1990s were the arena's booming years, but as the years progressed, it began to fall into disrepair. Talk to anyone who was part of “Dayton” at the time, and you will blanch at the horror stories as the arena began a slow decline. Hara was closed and eventually demolished, and the event moved to the Greene County Fairgrounds and Expo Center in Xenia, Ohio in 2017.



Why Dayton, you ask? Simply put, the Midwest is the demographic sweet spot to introduce new products. If a product succeeds here, it will most likely succeed nationwide. Midwestern populations often mirror the average US consumer in age, education, and household income...more traditional, mass-market consumers. Dayton Hamvention has been traditionally used to introduce new ham radio products to the hobbyists who use them.

This year was a bit of an anomaly in that regard, as no grand pronouncements were made by any manufacturer. Icom showed a new “concept” model mobile radio, the X-026, and a replacement dual-band mobile, the ID-5200A/E. Yaesu focused on live demonstrations and customer education. Kenwood displayed a production model of a long-anticipated TM-D750A tri-band mobile. Flex focused on their new Aurora Series of HF/6m radios, and Elecraft announced two new portable products for POTA/SOTA, an AX4 portable vertical antenna and companion BL3 balun. In revamping their brand and relocating their factory to Ohio, Ten-Tec showcased their Model 594 Phoenix transceiver, and continues to focus on their Alpha product line of amplifiers and tuners.



This year's attendance was a record-breaker at almost 38,000. Dayton Hamvention is easily the largest ham radio gathering of its kind in the world and offers much more than just a social gathering of like-minded amateur radio operators. Workshops, seminars, educational forums, equipment testing, youth rallies, satellite events, emergency communications and public service

deployments, license testing sessions, special event stations, club groups...if it's amateur radio related, it's at Dayton. You'll find antennas and mounts, electronic parts and kits, test gear, power gear, cables and connectors, computers, software, and survival gear. It's all to be found at Dayton, so start planning early and attend at least once in your ham radio lifetime.

Want to bring a companion that's not into ham radio? Dayton is full of beautiful metro parks, the National Air Force Museum, the American Packard Museum, breweries, distilleries, biking and hiking trails, art galleries, cemeteries full of history, and an historic district; it is surprising how much time one can spend pleasantly enjoying Dayton's many offerings. I sincerely hope you will make the time to take the trip someday

⚡

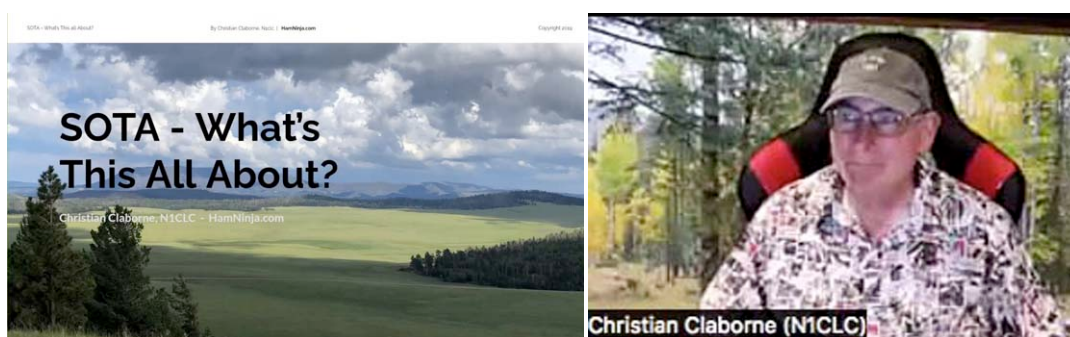

**ARRL Field Day 2026**

•Dan KI6X has the Field Day Spreadsheet on-screen. We will be 5A. We will have 2 Phone, 2 CW, 1 Digital FT8, a VHF/UHF station, a satellite station, and a GOTA station. 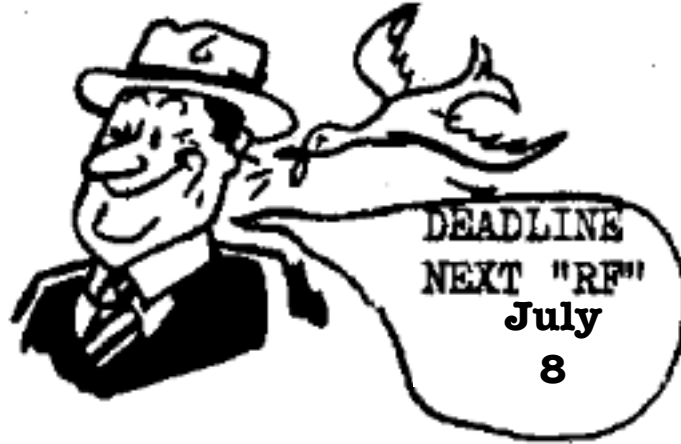
With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:55 AM.
