

"Cur editor has asked me to give the members a rundown of the recent ARRI convention. Since I wasn't aware at that time that I would be writing this, I didn't take notes or view the convention with a "reporter's eye": so I will have to rely on a poor memory. Now that I've established ry excuse for this being such a lousy article, I'll tell you about the convention.

The convention was a sell-out success, surpassing even the greatest expectations of the sponsors. Of the more than 1300 hams attending, only a little more than half had pre-registered. Naturally, the administrative chores necessary to register the halance of the hams really taxed the ability of the registration crews. A challange that was met most admirably and to the satisfaction of all. The Filton was sold sold out Friday afternoon and later arrivals had to bunk-down in nearby facilities.

The display area featured well over a dozen commercial exhibitors: and to insure that they received their share of convention traffic, a special prize drawing was established that required a validation stamp obtainable at each exhibition booth. A method that you'll probably see at more and more conventions in the future. Speaking of prizes, the sponsors passed out equipment worth over \$12,000 at the Saturday night banquet...CCCPS!! I think I goofed! I said banquet. and that word conveys a little more class and prestige to the plate of food placed on the tables by the Hilton Hotel than I would care to attach to it.

The real purpose of any convention, of course, is to present the technical forums. And This convention had some 21 different forums headed by very capable and learned leaders in the various fields of amateur radio. Also shown several times during the convention was the new ARRI public relations film designed for television. This new film, produced in color and narrated by Arthur Godfrey, should do much towards favorably presenting the story of amateur radio to the rublic. This would be a good film to show at one of our own club reetings.

It was gratifying to see so many Crange County members in attendance, especially since a convention would not be a convention without the "eyeball QSC's" (some very red) between old friends. All in all it was a good "trip" and I'm already looking forward to the next one...73"s...Pill, WB6QQR."

# Minutes of Board Meeting - September 8, 1969

The meeting was called to order at 1955 hours at the home of Jerry WA6ROF. All officers were present except Dave W6GPR. The first order of business was the selection of officers for 1970 to be recommended to the membership. They are as follows:

A motion was made and carried for the club to purchase addressograph plates for the sum of \$15.00.

Jack WB6UDC, volunteered to put together a publicity flyer regarding the coming club auction. A \$100.00 limit will be put on items to be auctioned. Members are requested to donate items to be auctioned. There will be a \$1.00 minimum bid on items to be auctioned. The club will charge a 20% commission on sales up to \$50.00, and a 10% commission on sales from \$50.00 - \$100.00.

Jack WB6UDC, will conduct the auction. He will be assisted by Dave WB6NRK. Bill WB6CQR, will be the treasurer. He will be assisted by Frank WB6TBU.

The forthcoming Christmas Party was discussed. Jack WB6UDC, is to investigate Renaldos in Fullerton as a possible site for the party. A charge of \$3.50 will be made for adults. Children who are under 12 years of age will be paid for by the club. A maximum of \$2.00 will be spent on each child's gift. It was recommended that a coupon be printed in R. F. with all the necessary information printed therein. Members have the option of cancelling their reservation up to one day prior to the party.

The ARRL Annual Report was read by Jerry WA6ROF. It showed that average club dues are now \$7.54 per year.

A motion was made to increase our club dues from \$3.50 per year to \$5.00 per year for members over 19 years of age, and to charge \$2.00 per year for members up to 19 years of age. This motion was not carried.

A motion was made and carried to increase our club dues from \$3.50 per year to \$6.00 per year for members over 19 years of age and to charge \$3.00 per year for members up to 19 years of age.

A motion was made and carried to change the club by-laws to read that additional members of the same household would pay \$3.00 per year dues. This would be effective for 1970.

The meeting was adjourned at 2245 hours.
