LA amateurs tune in, turn out to help Ecuadorian boy

One night in early October a radio message was relayed from Ecuador to the United States and picked up by amateur operators in Southern California. The message was brief but urgent. A 10-year-old boy, Paulino Freire, had a tumor of the pharynx growing in the back of his throat and impairing his breathing, said Frank Arturo Gangotena, HC1AG, in Quito. The boy was in desperate need of an operation but no doctor in his country could perform the surgery, and his parents were poverty-stricken.

Ted S. Henry, W6YEY/W6TOG, took action upon learning the situation and appealed to Gerald Blankfort, MD, WA6GTT, who immediately took on the project.

After many days of plowing through red tape of various efficial agencies, Blankfort finally arranged for the mother to bring her boy to Les Angeles. He secured a top surgeon specialist to schedule the surgery at UCLA Medical Center, free of charge.

The boy, who speaks no English, arrived with his mother. They were met at the airport by a group of amateurs who had raised \$5,000 to pay Paulino's travel and hospital expenses.

A large portion of the hospital bill is being picked up by the UCLA Alumni Association.

"It was a very touching experience,"
Dr. Blankfort said. "He was dressed in his
Sunday best. He put a medallion around
my neck and embraced me. Then in this
little voice he said, 'Gracias, Senor,
gracias.' It was one of the most emotional
experiences of my life."

Paulino underwent surgery on the morning of 30 October. The operation was successful and he is in good condition.

Paulino is staying with an East Los Angeles family while he recuperates, then will go home to Ecuador in about two weeks. When he leaves he will take with him a gift from Dr. Blankfort: an amateur radio of his own.

"We want to do it so he can always remember it was because of ham radio that we were able to do this for him." Blankfort said. "Then some day he may be able to help someone in the same way."

ARTICLE II, SECTION H.

MOTION - for Amendment to the Constitution of OCARC

GENERAL TITLE: AWARDING HONORARY MEMBERSHIP IN OCARC

- 1 HONORARY MEMBERSHIP in OCARC shall be considered appropriate by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the Board of Directors and then a simple majority vote of the membership present at a general business meeting of OCARC.
- 2. NOMINATION for Honorary Membership shall be initated during the "Good of the Club" portion of the business meeting and/or Board of Directors' meeting.
- 3 Any OCARC member in good standing may nominate any person for honorary membership using the guidelines of said person's qualifications in regards to their service to the Club, the community, and to Amateur Radio.
- 4. Honorary membership shall be for a term of at least one year to terminate on 31 Dec., but not to exceed twenty-three months, without renomination, as outlined in the following paragraph.
- 5. The names of all Honorary Members shall be reconsidered within three months prior to the expiration of their membership, and all Honorary Members' names receiving a two-thirds affirmative vote of the Board of Directors shall be submitted to the membership at the December Business Meeting for renewal of their Honorary Membership by a simple majority vote of the members present.
- 6. Honorary Members shall be ineligible to vote and ineligible to hold office in OCARC.
