TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS

THE SOLAR FLUX WAS ERRATIC ALL THROUGH SEPTEMBER, AND IN EARLY OCTOBER THE CURVE IS STILL TOTALLY UNLIKE THAT FOR THE PREVIOUS SOLAR ROTATION. OCTOBER BEGAN WITH 171 BUT A RISE WAS UNDER WAY AS THIS BULLETIN WAS ISSUED. IF THIS TURNS OUT TO BE A MAJOR UPWARD MOVEMENT A NEW BULLETIN WILL BE ISSUED IN ADVANCE OF THE USUAL WEEKLY SCHEDULE.

GENERALLY GOOD HF PROPAGATION IS EXPECTED THROUGH OCTOBER 7 OR 9, WITH A STRONG DISTURBANCE LIKELY AROUND THE 10TH. WITH THE SUN NEARING ITS BEST POSITION FOR THE TEMPERATE LATITUDES OF THE NORTHERN HEMISPHERE THE 28 MHZ BAND IS OPEN MORE HOURS DAILY THAN IN ANY PREVIOUS PERIOD OF THIS YEAR. LONG PATH PROPAGATION IS OBSERVED IN THE EARLY MORNING HOURS, WHENEVER THE WWV K INDEX IS LOW. USERS OF WWV PROPAGATION BULLETINS WILL NOTE THAT K VALUES ARE NOW CHANGED EVERY THREE HOURS. THIS WILL HELP TO MAKE THE BULLETINS EVEN MORE USEFUL FOR AMATEURS INTERESTED IN PROPAGATION STUDY. AMERICAN SUNSPOT NUMBERS FOR SEPTEMBER 25 THROUGH OCTOBER 1 WERE BETWEEN 126 AND 195, WITH AN AVERAGE OF 169.

TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS

THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION HAS PROPOSED ELIMINATING THE COMMERCIAL FIRST CLASS RADIO TELEPHONE OPERATOR LICENSE IN GENERAL DOCKET 20817. ACCORDING TO THE COMMISSION, MANY PERSONS BELIEVED THAT BECAUSE COMMERCIAL BROADCAST STATION LICENSEES ARE ULTIMATELY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE TECHNICAL PERFORMANCE OF THEIR STATIONS, SUCH STATIONS SHOULD NOT BE REQUIRED TO EMPLOY TECHNICIANS WHO HAVE BEEN EXAMINED AND LICENSED BY THE COMMISSION. RATHER, THEY SHOULD BE ABLE TO EMPLOY ANY QUALIFIED PERSON. COMMENTS ARE DUE NOVEMBER 14, 1980, WITH REPLY COMMENTS DUE DECEMBER 15, 1980.

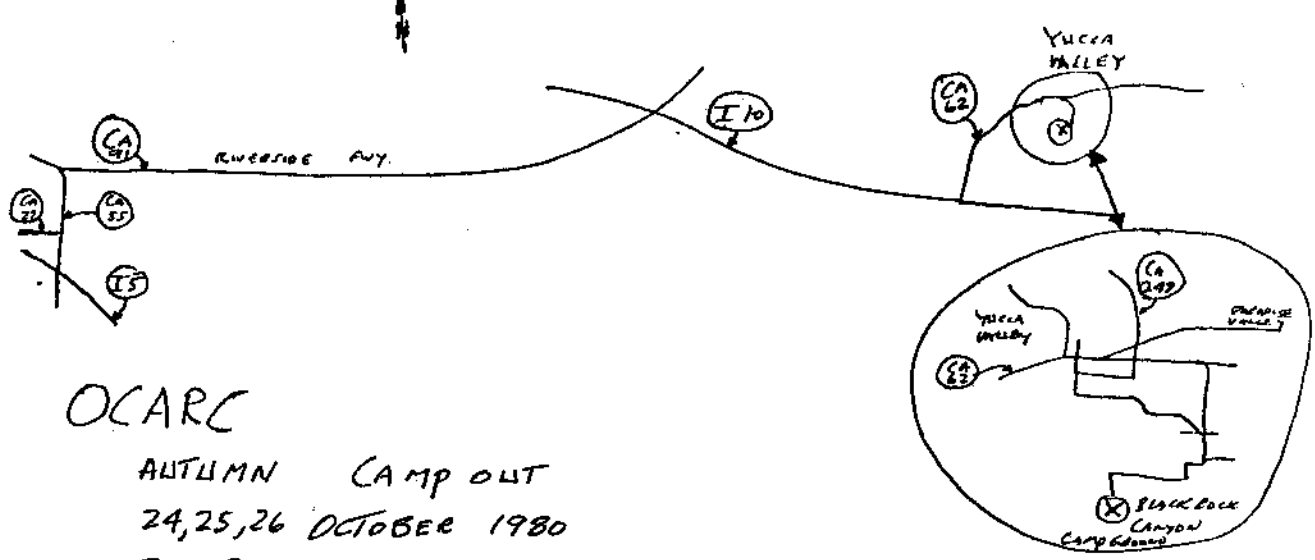

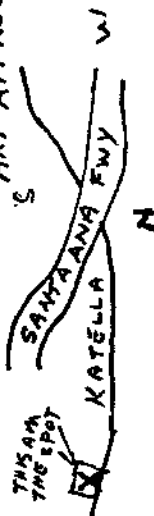
