QST DE W1AW HR PROPAGATION FORECAST BULLETIN NR 44 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS NEWING CT NOVEMBER 8, 1980

TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS

THE SOLAR FLUX ROSE IN EARLY NOVEMBER TO THE HIGHEST LEVELS OF THE YEAR, REACHING 302 ON THE 6TH. THIS BROUGHT NEAR BLACKOUTS OF HF PROPAGATION BRIEFLY, BUT IT PRODUCED THE BEST 50 MHZ DX SINCE LAST NOVEMBER. SOLAR FLARES PRODUCED SHORT PERIODS OF POOR HF COMMUNICATION, BUT THEIR WORST EFFECTS WILL BE FELT NOVEMBER 8 AND 9, IN THE FORM OF DEGRADED HIGH LATITUDE PROPAGATION ON ALL DX FREQUENCIES. THE BEST CONDITIONS WILL COME ABOUT NOVEMBER 10 TO 11, 13 TO 14, AND 17 TO 18.

THE TIMING OF FLARES AND THEIR AFTER EFFECTS ARE PREDICTABLE ONLY IN A GENERAL WAY. THE BEST SHORT TERM INDICATOR IS THE K INDEX GIVEN HOURLY BY WWY. VALUES OF 2 AND LOWER INDICATE GENERALLY GOOD CONDITIONS. PROPAGATION IN THE HIGHER LATITUDES IS LIKELY TO BE POOR WHEN THE INDEX IS 3 OR HIGHER. AMERICAN SUNSPOT NUMBERS FOR OCTOBER 30 THROUGH NOVEMBER 5 WERE BETWEEN 174 AND 209, WITH A MEAN OF 187. THEY SHOULD BE DROPPING DURING THE FORECAST WEEK.

QST DE W1AW HR ARRL BULLETIN NR 115 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS, NEWINGTON CT. NOVEMBER 6, 1980

TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS

FCC TODAY GRANTED A PETTITION OF DEL NORTE TECHNOLOGY PERMITTING THE CONTINUATION OF RADIO LOCATION IN THE 420 TO 450 MHZ BAND ON A NON INTERFERENCE BASIS. THE COMMISSION ALSO UPHELD A STAFF INTERPRETATION THAT AN UNLICENSED PERSON MAY NOT OPERATE AN AMATEUR RADIO STATION TO CONTROL MODEL CRAFT. ALSO AT THIS MEETING, THE COMMISSION DECIDED NOT TO CONSIDER RM 3240, A REQUEST TO PERMIT TYPE F1 EMISSION RADIOTELEPRINTER OPERATIONS ON THE 160 METER BAND. THE COMMISSION NOTED THAT IT WAS PREMATURE TO CONSIDER THE 160 METER PROPOSAL NOW BECAUSE THE BULK OF THE WORLD ADMINISTRATIVE RADIO CONFERENCE REALLOCATION MATTERS WOULD BE PRESENTED ON NOVEMBER 25.
