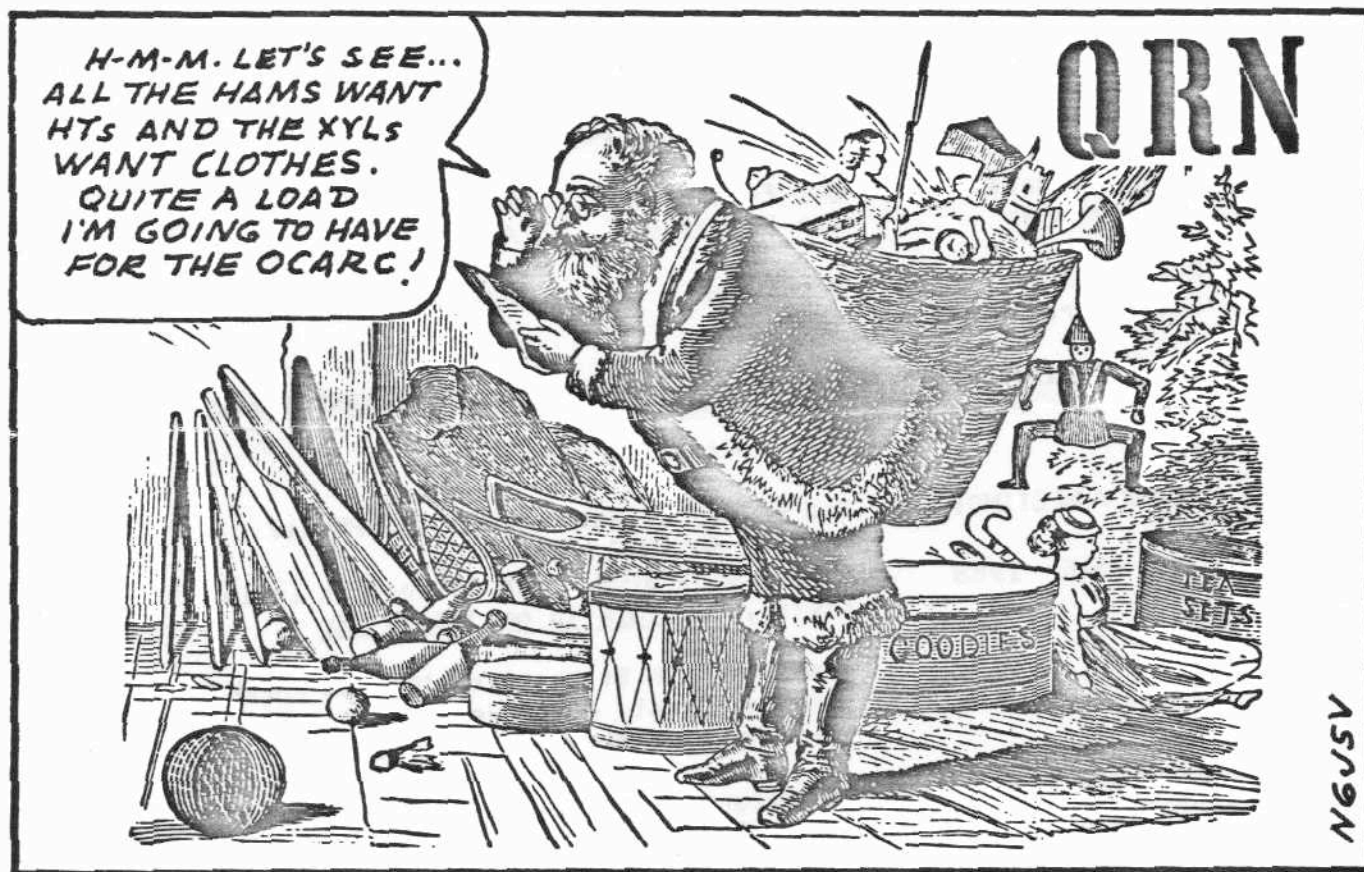

*** DIABETES BIKEATHON ***



Navy-Marine Corps MARS is looking for a few good men (and women) to enter training in late January 1987. If you have an interest in traffic handling and have the "right stuff", this may be for you. This emergency communications oriented service handles 1500 radiograms per month to/from servicemen and women in Southern California using Navy protocols on USB, RTTY, and HF Packet. We also run phone patches to ships and stations worldwide on Navy frequencies. Training takes 10 weeks and starts quarterly. MARS time may count as Naval Reserve time, and all members may take Navy Correspondence Courses in Electronics and Communications.

The "right stuff" includes valid Tech or higher Amateur License, HF ALL BAND capability, RTTY, and at least 10 hours per week during training and 2 hours afterward. There is limited surplus equipment for issue after six months service.

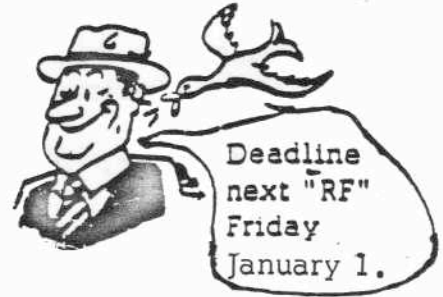
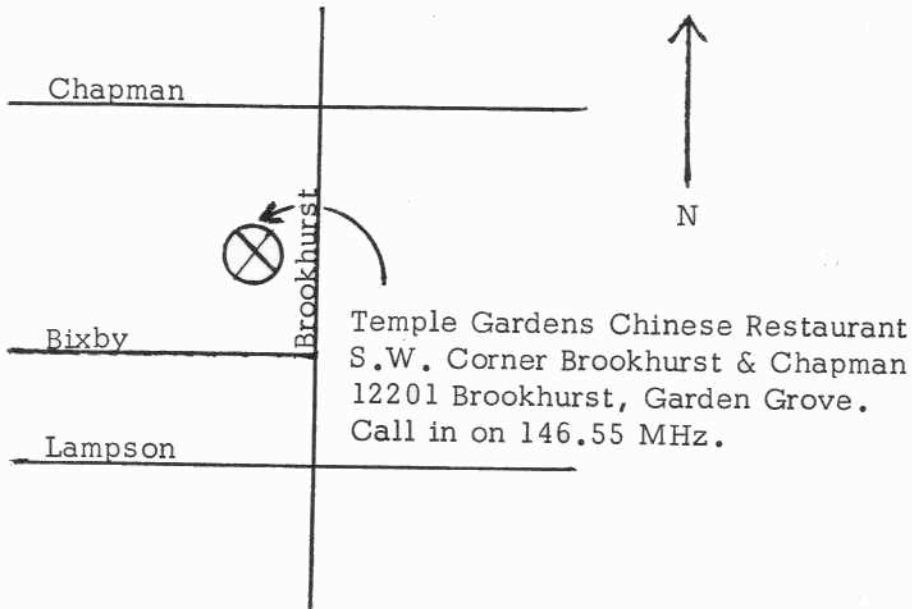
